Typical Daily Activities

Each day the service users will be required to provide Rex with fresh food and water. Rex is spot cleaned and lightly misted daily and big cleaned once a week which the service users also help with. Rex loves cuddles and so the service users are encouraged to spend time handling him each day.

Whilst Bearded Dragons inhabit large parts of Australia they tend to stick to warm arid areas such as deserts, savannahs and scrublands. Bearded Dragons are solitary by nature.

Did You Know?

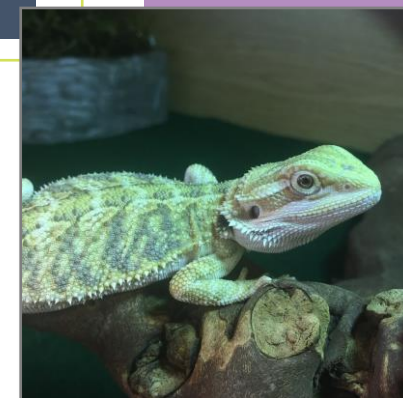
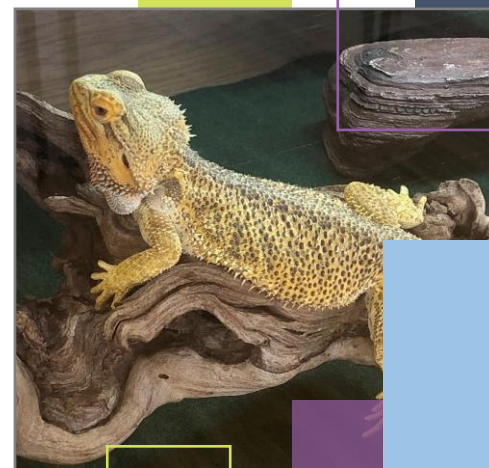
Bearded Dragons have 3 eyes and can run up to 9mph!

Average Lifespan: 5-8 Years in the wild and 10-12 Years in captivity.

Diet: As omnivores Bearded Dragons eat both vegetation, insects and a small amount of fruit. The most common insects used in captivity being locusts and crickets. In captivity Bearded Dragons need calcium supplements adding to their food to help prevent Metabolic Bone Disease.
